

Targa New Zealand Two Day Regional 2021

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS (TWO DAY REGIONAL COMPETITION)

1. JURISDICTION

This event will be a **Tarmac Rally** event known as "Targa New Zealand Two Day Regional 2021" promoted by **URG (Promotions) NZ Ltd** on behalf of **Club Targa Inc** hereafter referred to as "The Event".

Targa New Zealand Two Day Regional 2021 Tour will take place from **Saturday 28th May to Sunday 29th May 2022.**

The Event will be held under the Australian Auto-Sport Alliance Standing Regulations for Tarmac Rallies and their National Competition Rules (NCR's), the 2022 Targa NZ Seria Campione Series Regulations, Schedule TR, and these Supplementary Regulations.

3. <u>THE EVENT</u>

Targa New Zealand Two Day Regional 2021 is a two (2) day Tarmac Rally event, and is Round 2A of the 2021 Targa NZ Seria Campione consisting of the last two Legs of the Targa New Zealand 2021 rally (being Legs 4 and 5).

3.1 Venue: Targa New Zealand Two Day Regional 2021 Competition starts in Whanganui and travels through the Ruapehu, Rangitikei, Hastings and Central Hawkes Bay districts and finishes in Havelock North.
There are 11 stages in total. This is broken down to 6 stages for Legs 4 and 5 stages for Leg 5.

Service stops are as follows:

Leg 4 – Waiouru and Taihape

Leg 5 – Taradale, Havelock North and Waipawa

3.2 Length: Comprises of approx. **303.71km** of closed roads and **402.27km** of touring.

3.3 Leg Four – Saturday 28th May: First Car starts from Whanganui at 8:00am and finishes at 2:55pm in Havelock North.

3.4 Leg Five – Sunday 29th May: First Car starts from Havelock North at 8:00am and finishes at 4:20pm in Havelock North.

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Entry Fees

All listed fees are plus GST. The compulsory Medical Levy, RallySafe, Health & Safety and Safety Notes fees are payable in addition to the Entry Fee.

4.2 Entries are open from the publication of these Supplementary Regulations and close at **5:00pm** on **Friday 20th May 2022**.

4.3 Entry Acceptance: Entries shall be made online via the website <u>www.targa.nz</u> and to be deemed valid must complete all details and pay the appropriate fees. Acceptance will be at the Organising Committees' discretion. Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.



4.4 Number of Starters: The organisers reserve the right to abandon the event if less than 20 entries are received at normal closing date. The maximum number of competition starters will be 40. Any additional entries received will be on the reserve list in order of receipt.

4.5 Competitor Requirements:

(1) Knowledge and Understandings: In signing the entry form competitors (Entrant and Drivers) are deemed to fully understand the AASA National Competition Rules and its relevant Appendices and Schedules. Particularly the National Competition Rules articles pertaining to protests and competitor's obligations.

(2) Licence Requirements: All Drivers and Co-Drivers are required to hold a AASA National Rally Licence and a current full civil driving licence or a National Navigators Licence if not intending to drive (except when exempted within a component of the event).

(3) New Competitors: Any driver(s) who have not previously competed in three or more rallies must attend the novice competitor briefing. **Refer to Regulation 6.4**.

(4) Apparel: All competitors are required to comply with appendix 4 of the AASA NCRs - Tarmac Rally refer to https://aasa.com.au/wp-content/uploads/Appendix-4-Apparel-1.6-1.pdf

5. ELIGIBLE VEHICLES

5.1 Compliance: All vehicles shall comply with Schedule TR.

5.2 Tyres: There are no restrictions as to the make and model or number of tyres used by Participants. However any type must comply with current NZTA warrant of fitness regulations.

5.3 RallySafe GPS: 'RallySafe' tracking and timing technology will be used during this event. An overview of the system which provides significant safety benefits can be found on <u>www.rallysafe.com.au</u>.

a) A 'one off' cost of approximately \$AUD175 (plus shipping) to purchase a Permanent Installation Kit (wiring, brackets and aerials). These must be ordered from RallySafe using the online purchase form found at <u>www.rallysafe.com.au</u>.

b) An event cost (for all competitors) of \$75 + GST per day to be added to the entry fee.

NOTE: Please make sure that you have ordered and received a wiring kit at least two weeks prior to the event.



Your vehicle must be fitted with an operational RallySafe device. This device must be switched on from scrutineering through until the end of the event. Failure to comply will incur a penalty as set out in the 2022 Targa NZ Seria Campione Tarmac Rally Championship Series Regulations 15.2.18.

RallySafe units are to be collected, fitted and tested at the scrutineering venue. The units are to be returned to RallySafe immediately after the finish line on Sunday 29th May or at any lunch stop or end of day during the Event. All units must be returned before leaving the Event.

5.4 Competitions: Targa NZ vehicles will be divided into the following competitions:

- Classic 2WD
- Production (GT2) 2WD
- Production (GT4) 4WD
- Allcomers (Extreme) 2WD & 4WD

Refer to regulation 3.5 of the 2022 Targa NZ Seria Campione Tarmac Rally Championship Series Regulations.

6. SCRUTINEERING, DOCUMENTATION AND DRIVER BRIEFING

6.1 Scrutineering: Competitors **must** present their car for scrutineering prior to processing through to documentation for the **checking of AASA and Civil** licenses and Proof of Insurance.

Scrutineering will take place on Friday 27th May as follows:

- Venue: Whanganui War Memorial Centre, Whanganui
- Time: 3:30pm 5:30pm

You must complete scrutineering within this time slot unless arranged prior with the Event Secretary. All crews must attend scrutineering and cannot go directly to documentation.

All cars will be required to hold a AASA passport to compete in Targa. At scrutineering you will be given a pre-approved temporary passport based on the information you provided on your entry form. At scrutineering, your car will be scrutineered by a AASA Scrutineer. Upon completion of the scrutineering two photos of your car will be taken and all details will be used to process your passport.

10. START ORDER, SEEDING & RESULTS

10.1 Provisional Start Order: Will be published on the Targa NZ website <u>www.targa.nz</u> no later than two days before the start of the event and on the Official Notice Board at the start of the event.

Start Order for each leg will be posted on the Targa NZ website each night no later than 8 hours prior to the start of the next Leg. It will be on the Official Notice Board at the start of each leg.

10.2 Results: Progressive results are available on <u>www.chrissport.co.nz</u>.

10.3 Provisional Results: These will be posted on the Official Notice Board and on ChrisSport on Sunday 29th May, approximately 30 minutes after the last car finishes.

10.3.1 Final Results: The Provisional Results will become final 30 minutes after posting providing there are no protests.

10.4 Control Procedures: All competitors must check in on their due report time at all controls. Early entry will incur a minute for minute penalty. Late check in will incur a 10 second per minute penalty.

11. COMPETITOR RESPONSIBILITY

11.1 Electronic Red Flag: May be used within this event. An Electronic Red Flag will come to you as a message on the RallySafe unit. You will need to acknowledge this message to clear the unit. Upon receipt of this Electronic Red Flag, you MUST slow down and tour at a safe pace to the end of the stage. Failure to comply with this request can result in a maximum penalty of \$500 and/or exclusion from the Event at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

11.2 Change of Co-Driver: It is permissible to change a Co-Driver providing the following conditions have been met;

 The approval from the Clerk of the Course has been gained.
 The substitute Co-Driver has completed all documentation and entry requirements, including a Novice Briefing if they are a Novice.
 Change of Co-Driver can be undertaken at control as long as the Clerk of the Course has given prior approval.

(4) One (1) additional Co-Driver may be introduced and the competitor will still be classed as a finisher provided all other regulations are met.

(5) All of the above steps MUST be completed prior to the change of co-driver. Non-notification will result in exclusion.



12. STAGE NOTES

Stage Notes will be available from the Providers two weeks before the event.

13. CODE OF PRACTICE FUEL

Competitors and Service Crews must comply with the AASA NCRs, Regulation 5.7.

14. <u>SERVICING & SERVICE PARKS</u>

Servicing is strictly limited to the designated Service Parks along the Rally Route.

Repairs to continue in the Event is allowable anywhere as long as the Crew are the only people that touch or work on the vehicle and the parts used are being carried by the competition vehicle.

Judge of Fact is any Targa Official or any other person with the Event with photographic evidence. Penalties could be applied.

15. PARC FERME

Any Crew Member can check the car into an end of leg Parc Ferme. Check in to Parc Ferme will be electronically monitored from Rally Base.

All competitors must have their vehicle in Parc Ferme by their due time.

Failure to report to Parc Ferme by their due time will be penalised as a Temporary Withdrawal.

Competitors must return their vehicle to Parc Ferme prior to the first car commencing the following day. Failure to do so will result in an additional time penalty of 2 minutes.

Parc Ferme for Competitors will finish 30 minutes before their due Start Time for a Leg where the crew may work on their vehicle.

Refuelling is prohibited. Failure to comply may result in penalties.



16. PRIZE GIVING

Prizegiving will be held as follows:
